I am learning more about who I am, and it surprises me at times that I am stronger than I ever thought possible. I am learning new things every day. With God's help I am trying to embrace the moment I am in, good or bad, trusting the Holy Spirit to bring me through. The prayers of family and friends and those who are reading our Heart and Hand newsletters have been such an encouragement to me. Thank you for your cards, personal notes, and emails.

This is my personal grief journey, and it may not be yours. I really am going to be all right and that is the good news, but I need to be honest with what is really happening within my heart, within my body and my emotions, and in my soul. How about you? Are you being honest when people ask you how are you feeling? Those four words are so difficult to answer, and do you not wish that we could tell family and friends to stop asking that question? I do, but I do not tell them to stop. Most family and friends mean well so we try to be kind and we say something, but we do not reveal the pain

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we are experiencing. By now, everyone wants me to feel a whole lot better and there are times that I do. I am so grateful for those times when I see progress.

I am functioning, and God is still using me in spite of all the feelings I am feeling. I even got the opportunity to speak at a church recently for the first time since my losses and I made it through.

God is so faithful. Honestly, I could hardly breathe but the opportunity came, and I refuse for the enemy of my soul to stop me from serving the Lord or sharing the good news of His faithfulness to me no matter how I was feeling. It was all about Him anyway. Having joy on my journey. Have you lost your joy?

IT WASN'T SUPPOSED TO BE THIS WAY

It wasn't supposed to be this way.

I thought God and I had an understanding that undergoing brain surgery would be the hardest part of my journey. That seemed fair to me.

My planned outcome looked something like this:

1. God receives all the glory for a successful surgery.
2. I would recover faster than expected because I am awesome.
3. I would reach the 5-year milestone of remission (medically cured) and be able to truly put all of this behind us.

There was no room on my checklist for new tumors, new diseases, depression, brain fatigue, constant scans, and a backseat to my life.

I spent the first year of my recovery disappointed that God didn't keep His end

of our agreement.

It wasn't supposed to be this way.

It was supposed to be His way.

God used my unwanted alone time to draw me closer to Him.

I was unable to distract myself with TV, books, or music because of nausea and sensory overload. It's like God made it almost impossible for me to avoid Him.

I needed to make the daily choice of offering up my disappointment and hurt that kept reappearing and to wait on Him.

I only partially trusted God. I trusted and needed Him to get me through the surgery, but I had every intention of taking over from there. My plan was to get back to the way things were. I thought that was the best plan. God's plan is to keep me moving forward with Him. Fully surrendered. Fully dependent. Fully content.

God never promised me that hardships would cease after surgery and that it would be smooth sailing from there on. I promised



that to myself and assumed God would bless it because I'd earned it. Basic false beliefs slipped through my cracks because I wasn't wearing my full armor. I spent the first year of my recovery focusing on what God wasn't doing, not what I wasn't doing.

5 years is still 5 years of living.

My definition of remission needed to be updated. The lens of how I viewed my circumstances needed to change. I could either view it as a punishment or as a gift.

To think I almost categorized my circumstance as punishment. I almost missed the tremendous and gracious gift of the past 5 years because it didn't match my checklist.

God's plan was always greater than mine. I needed to allow God to change the lens of how I viewed my life. I've learned that when God is the only thing on my agenda, my lens automatically autocorrects to a holy view.

His promises are true. His promises, not mine.
