My heart still aches when I think of my brother.

Fred Trout was born March 13, 1938. Besides being an alcoholic, Fred suffered a life-long battle with depression. My father physically abused Fred. On top of that, Freddie was a difficult rebellious child. Eventually Mom got a job and sent him away to relatives and then to a Christian boarding school to protect him from my father.

Mom did get a letter from the school saying Fred went forward for salvation while he was there. Eventually, Fred quit school and joined the Army so he could "do as he pleased." Afterwards, he came home and finished high school, but he remained quietly apart from others, including our family.


He wouldn't allow us to love him; it was too painful and risky, I guess.

My mother's prayers for my brother never stopped. She marked this scripture in her devotional: *I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that He is able to keep that which I have committed unto Him against that day* (1 Timothy 1:12). She died in 1996 not seeing this most heartfelt prayer answered.

Fred died in February 2005 in Florida, alone. Mourning for Freddie was painful. The childhood ache of watching my brother suffer and being unable to help him resurfaced.

However, Fred must have finally made a step toward his Lord to whom he gave his heart so many years ago. On November 11, 2007, the Lord gave me a dream about him.

Fred was in heaven. He was CHANGED! He was full of joy and so happy! He even recognized me and hugged me – hard!



A profound peace came into me. I knew this dream was from God. I will see Fred forever more just like that.

I no longer walk in grief. God has taken it away.

Mom's prayers for Freddie were answered! Our prayers don't die with us! My heart still aches when I think of my brother, but now the ache is the longing to see him in heaven!


