Reaching for a hand and touching a heart.

A Conversation with God

*Shared at the 20th Anniversary Gala
by Chaplain Liz on October 4, 2024*

I am not here to preach or teach but to have a conversation with God. I invite everyone who is here tonight to listen in to my conversation with Him

Hi God, it is your daughter Elizabeth. There are a lot of people listening tonight to my conversation with you. Usually, it is just me and you, but tonight I have asked others to listen in because Lord, this evening is all about you.

You make a way when there seems to be no way. You are a healer and a provider of all that we need.

You are still working through ordinary people like me, proving dreams can be given and can come true no matter how old you are or how long it takes.

I want to declare tonight, Lord, that you are my God. I will exalt you and praise your name for in perfect faithfulness you have done wonderful things, things planned long ago.

At 11 years old, I remember my conversation with you. I decided to give you my life. I did not really understand what all that meant, but the unconditional love that Jesus Christ displayed on the cross for my sins was what I needed so desperately.

You were aware of my home life. I could not be taken out of the environment that I was in,



but you gave me your Word to guide me and people to come alongside me to show me how I could still live in victory despite what was happening around me. At my young age, I had so many questions for you, Lord, but you were always so patient with me. When I failed to do what I knew you wanted me to do, you always extended your mercy and grace to me.

God, you were my first love!

Then you gave me Arvid, my second love who was in my life for 57 years. You blessed us with three children and eight grandchildren. You knew, Lord, what I would need to accomplish and what you wanted me to do. Arvid was perfect for the assignment because he was a

man of integrity. You knew, Lord, that he loved you with all his heart. You also knew he was good with math, and we needed a treasurer!

However, you also knew that Arvid did not always understand the dream that you had given me and how it was going to be accomplished using his wife. He had as many questions as I had for you. After all, Arvid was a brilliant engineer, and you know, Lord, how engineers think. Arvid watched over the years to see the plan unfold step by step. He prayed and supported me as you prepared me for Chaplaincy Ministry and Spiritual Care Support Ministry and this huge responsibility that I would have.

► In 2020, during the pandemic, the dream of the Center (the house on the hill) became a reality. Before Arvid died, you would allow him the blessing of seeing this dream come to pass.

The “House on the Hill” was completed because of the kindness of Gray and Debbe Coyner, who told me that you, Lord, told them to build a house for God. Many people contributed to the building of this Center, and you know Lord who they are. It took seven years to complete. We waited and believed.

In 1985, I spent days and nights with my terminally ill mother as she lay in her hospital bed. I quickly began to see the need for additional support for those who were sick, dying and experiencing the loss of loved ones and personal losses, as well as those who journey with them.

In my vigil by my mother’s bedside, I heard patients crying in the night wanting someone to pray with them, to hold their hand, and to listen to their emotional, physical, and spiritual pain. While sharing their personal stories with me in the night hours, it was clear that they had so many unresolved issues that were never met, and thus they never found healing and meaning in life.

Lord, you knew this would happen and from that experience, I began to pursue getting credentials for Chaplaincy ministry to be able to minister to those suffering.

You opened doors for me that no one could shut, and you saw more in me that could be accomplished than I could see in myself.



In 1989, I had just come home from working as a Chaplain at the hospital as well as having visited some of my Hospice patients. There were losses that day, and I was tired and feeling very discouraged.

Lord, you gave me opportunities that year to hear stories from patients, families, and staff about the lack of support they felt from their family and friends, their faith communities, or other community agencies. The Christians were defeated and found no joy as they had experienced personal losses. They felt disappointment in their walk with you, Lord, and in their relationships with others.

Those who did not know you personally did not want anything to do with you because of the challenges they were facing. They felt that you were not someone they could trust. They often would ask me, “How could God allow this to happen to me?” Both groups complained that “nobody really listens to our pain, they always just want to fix us.” “They want us to get on with our lives.”

You know how important it is to help people of any age to mourn and go public with their pain of loss so that unresolved issues can be dealt with so that they can find healing and meaning in their lives.

More seeds were planted in my heart for those suffering during those months of conversations.

I told Arvid when I got home from work that I did not want to eat, but I was going straight to bed. I was not in the best of moods that night. Before I went to bed, I got on my knees and had a conversation with you, Lord.

Do you remember, God, when I said to you, “Lord, how are you going to bring hope to people who are suffering? How can we get people to understand that you can be counted on to see them through the challenges that they face and that you love them and see their struggles?” I begged you to do something, not realizing that you already had a plan as you knew the future and how our world would be experiencing losses in their lives like never before. I then ►



► went to bed. You knew, Lord, what was going to happen, didn't you? I woke up the next morning. My body was shaking and trembling, and my heart was pounding. Arvid wanted to call 911, but I told him that I was not sick and no, I did not need a doctor.

I had a dream and God spoke to me. God gave me the vision in my dream as to how we could help people who were sick, dying, grieving and experiencing personal losses, and those who journey with them. It would be a "house on the hill." I saw people coming into the Center who were suffering from emotional, physical, relational, financial, and spiritual pain. Pain was on their faces, which were stained with tears.

I saw people leaving the Center with hope, smiling, hugging, some were skipping and praising you, Lord, as they went down the road.

Instead of seeing a doctor, we called our pastor, Rev. Daniel Astuto, to make an appointment to see him immediately.

Lord, you gave me that dream, and you helped me fulfill it. You provided scriptures, and my reliance was on you. You encouraged me to take actionable steps toward the dream while trusting your timing and provision.

You continue to teach me in countless little ways. You guide me on so many paths unknown.

You guard me as a shepherd keeps his own. You shield me, though I may not always see the many ways you deliver me. You lift me up when I fall, and you help me stand. You hold me in the hollow of your hand. Your Word is my counsel. Your power is my courage. Your promises are my comfort. Your presence is my confidence.

I rest my life, my soul, my future, and the future of Spiritual Care Support Ministries in your hands. Amen!

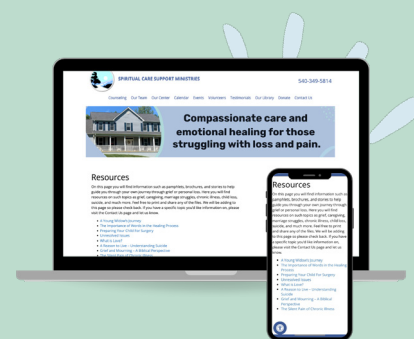
